Ministry Report - January 1, 2020

Lynne Gardiner started with the Delta-Toledo Pastoral Charge as a Student Intern Minister through the SME (Supervised Ministry Education Process) on July 5, 2015 with her first Worship service being held on July 12^{th.} On May 28, 2017, she was ordained at Wall Street United Church with many from both churches in attendance. In June of this year Rev Lynne told us of her plans to move on to another Pastoral Charge starting October 1, 2019. We thank Rev Lynne for her time with us and wish her all the best.

Since that time, we have been very successful in having Lay Worship Leaders – some trained and some from our own congregation along with Rev Myra Garvin who shared communion with us in December.

This process, while it may not be steady with one leader, has worked in other churches and could be the future of the United Church of Canada as there are many Ministers retiring and not many coming along to take their place. This is not only happening here in the Delta-Toledo Pastoral Charge but locally and throughout the Country.

One of the major issues is declining attendance making for reduced income to pay for a full time Minister's salary. Don't get me wrong they are worth every penny after all the training they have gone through plus the fact that a Minister's job can be 24 hours, seven days a week, especially when pastoral care is needed.

Pastoral care is also a very important part of our ministry, but we do have a Membership and Outreach Chair on Council as well as our UCW Chair. It is not a formal committee, per se, but these folks do a great job in sending cards, flowers, gifts and prayer shawls and prayers and visitation to those in need and we will continue to do so. Pat Philips and Rev Bruce Ross do a great job in keeping us informed of those in need of our help in the community.

So, 2020 starts off a new decade and a change in the way we have been doing church. We need to take some time to reflect and decide what "Church" really means to us. Your new Council will have some decisions to make but we need your positive suggestions that will help us to move forward. Perhaps it will allow us to focus more on outreach in our community and in the greater world. If you are interested in helping in any way, please contact one of your Council Chairs.

We trust that God is with us and pray that God will show us the 'way' to continue to be *"Church"* in this community. Amen!

Chairpersons Report for Year End 2019

Good afternoon Friends and Neighbours:

The past year as the Chairperson of Delta United Church I have brought forward ideas and suggestions to move forward in our planning for the future. I believe the financial commitments to move forward dictated some urgency in dealing with the cash flow record that allows a sustainable future. In late Sept. 2018 the discussions took more time then what most attendees wanted to commit; to listen. Throughout the past year Council meetings have not been well attended. It seems a Council meeting is only important to the extent that one can attend when there is nothing else happening that is a better alternative.

My understanding of leadership has a different approach than what some people perceive. I believe one can only lead when you have a "vision" for the future. Leadership involves looking at tomorrow. Leadership is different than management as management only looks after the outcomes of yesterday's decisions. When I have difficulty coping with questions and the why's of events and discussions working toward a sustainable future, I often go back to reading a book entitled: Exploring Spirituality, Going Deep in Life and Leadership by Dr. Ian Percy. Ian Percy was the motivational speaker at the Social Services Conference in Toronto in November 1997. Ian has degrees in theological education and organizational psychology and is registered with the College of Psychologists of British Columbia.

In Ian's book he outlines the inconsistencies and shortfalls that commonly dog organizations. In Short, he laid before us the spectacle of organizations trying to function without passion, without hope, without soul. I have been feeling for a while now that I no longer have the passion, the hope to lead the organization into the future. In his book it is quoted "whether or not such organizations will survive the challenges that face our society as we move into the next millennium is highly debatable." "Without leadership there is no "followership"." There is no followership without honesty and inspiration. These must radiate and pulsate from the leaders to assure lasting organizational success. An organization – as a living being – deteriorates when official communication is inconsistent and out of character with what's touted as its "values and beliefs".

Lately, I have been questioning my sense of accomplishment. A salient point in the book has helped in my decision-making process. I no longer have the passion, the hope needed to lead the organization. Hope says, "we are getting there". Faith says, "Act as if you are there!" The future that we are 'faithing' is there already. It is we who are not there yet. It is not distant from us; we are distant from it. We are the ones who must move.

In a final quote from Ian's book, "When you don't believe, you don't belong." I don't believe in the direction we are headed. I will step aside and allow others to lead the organization into the future. Effective prior to the annual meeting I will resign, relinquish my duties and responsibilities to the benefit of a future for the Delta United Church.

I pray that we will continue to be church in this community. In September we celebrated 191 years as a congregation. I can't even imagine the challenges that the first settlers went through to get where we are now; however, the church survived then, and I have hope that it will now.

I believe that God will keep a presence in this community. It may be different than in the past, but we will continue to carry on as we are a people of hope!





Eastern Ontario Outaouais Regional Council (EOORC) for 2019

The year started out with promise as we continued investigating the possibility of clustering with many other United Church parishes in our county. This was an enthusiastic initiative but unfortunately, the timeline and slow pace of action deterred progress.

I asked council to allow me to run a talent show in June (Delta's Got Talent) and provide a financial net for expenses. I also approached other churches for performers. St. Andrew's United in Toledo provided financial support, but all other parishes did not participate. Regardless, we raised more than the expenses just from sponsors and the event turned over \$2,300 in profit. This money went into the church coffers to help offset the costs of running the hall for outreach and to provide pay-what-you-can meals for the community. The winners were two girls, age 11 and 13, from Kingston who sang and played their hearts out.

The first regional Eastern Ontario Outaouais Regional Council (EOORC) meeting was held in May but I was unable to attend. It was the day of my deceased mother's interment. Rev. Lynne went and reported back to council that it was relatively uneventful.

The second regional EOORC meeting was on October 5th in Prescott and I attended with Carolyn Bennett from St. Andrew's United in Toledo. After a lovely service led by the youth of the parish, several motions were voted on and much to my protest there was a motion to prevent any former ministers from visiting the parish they left for three years. This meant Rev. Lynne, who had previously announced she was leaving us (without a replacement), cannot come back at any time if needed in a religious or social capacity including attending events or social gatherings in our parish. The vote passed.

Ministry and Personnel Committee

The committee consists of two representatives from Delta, Louis Whitty and Grant Ross, and two from St. Andrews's, Anna Johnston and Nancy Struthers.

We are responsible for being available for consultation and support for matters involving the pastoral charge staff. In our case, that is the minister, organist and custodian. We are also responsible for overseeing the relationship of the pastoral charge staff to each other and the people in the congregation. We make recommendations to the governing body regarding salary, study leave, vacation and compensation, etc.

On June 16, we received Revered Lynne Gardiner's letter of resignation. On July 17, we met with Reverend Lynne to address her concern that was working without a contract for her termination period, July 1 to September 20. 


